Emperor William III.
BERLIN, Dec. 8.—(Via Amsterdam and London, 6:15 p. m.)—It was officially announced this afternoon that Emperor William is ill. Despite his indisposition, it is said, he is able to give attention to reports of the war situation from the chief of the general staff.

Important Advance by Allies.
LONDON, Dec. 9.—(3:25 a. m.)—A Daily Express correspondent telegraphing from the Belgian frontier says:
"The German divisional headquarters was removed from Auders when shells began to fall in the town after the British had recaptured Passchendaele, 11 miles northwest of Ypres."
"This indicates a distinct and important advance by the Allies."

Rural Credit Legislation.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—Notwithstanding President Wilson's failure to include rural credit legislation in the session's program, Senator Owen today called a meeting of the banking and currency committee for Tuesday for consideration of bills on this subject.
An attempt will be made to perfect a bill, even if it is not passed at this session, committee members said.

New Holiday For Mail Carriers.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—Every Christmas day hereafter would be a legal holiday for the rural letter carriers of the United States, under a bill introduced today by Representative Park of Georgia.

Cotton Being Washed Ashore.
ESBJERG, Denmark, Dec. 8.—The Norwegian steamer Nygaard, from Pensacola, October 31, before reported ashore, outside of this port, has broken in two. Her cargo of cotton is being washed ashore.

Ship Purchase Bill.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—The administration's ship purchase bill will be pressed in accordance with the president's recommendation, Chairman Alexander of the house merchant marine committee, announced today. There is considerable opposition to the bill in the house.

German Attack Repulsed.
PARIS, Dec. 8.—(10:35 p. m.)—The following official communication was issued by the French war office tonight:
"In Belgium a violent German attack on St. Eloy, south of Ypres, has been repulsed. The struggle at all times is very lively in the forests and to the east of Argonne."

VALUABLE GUIDE FOR PLANTING OF FLOWERS
Of Special Interest to School Improvement Associations.

What kind of plants are best suited for sunny gardens, shady gardens, rock places, sandy places and window boxes is the subject of an interesting and instructive article which has been received by Miss Maggie M. Garlington, county supervisor of rural school from Miss Ellen Eddy Shaw, editor of Children's Garden Magazine, published by Doubleday, Page & Co. of Garden City, New York.

The articles should prove of special value to school teachers, pupils and school improvement associations throughout the county, as it gives information which probably could not be had from a reliable source without considerable difficulty. By glancing at this table one can tell to a nicety what kind of plants are most suitable for a certain kind of garden. The table is as follows:

Plants for Sunny Gardens—Balsam, gallardia, nasturtium, portulaca, petunia, cornflower, ageratum, snapdragon, poppy, sunflower.

Plants for Shady Gardens—Pansy, fuchs, begonias, fern, myrtle, godelia, ranunculus, bluebells, phlox, feverfew.

Plants for Rock Places—baby's breath, candytuft, clarkia, nasturtium, portulaca, Columbine.

Plants for Sandy Places—Godetia, portulaca, sionia, nasturtium, poppy mallow, sunflower.

Plants for Window Boxes—Fuchsia, geranium, alyssum, candytuft, begonia, wandering Jew, English ivy, dracaena, sincus, coco palm.
