ALL OVER THE HOUSE.
A Plea For the Old Way of Roasting as Against Baking.

It is to be feared that many excellent modes of cooking which prevailed in the past are now abandoned simply to save trouble. The modern cook, or the person who calls herself such, although she may be positively instructed to roast meat in the good old fashioned way in a screen in front of the fire, commonly ignores her instructions at every possible opportunity and puts the joint in the oven. The introduction of the "kitchen" or the closed range and of the gas cooker probably accounts for the preference which is given to baking, while it does away with the necessity of basting and other little but important culinary attentions which roasting involves. There can be little doubt that by this exchange of method not a few persons are dietetic sufferers.

The preference for meat openly roasted before the fire is not a mere sentiment, for the flavor of meat so cooked is infinitely superior, and the tissue is generally more tender than when it is baked. Now, the flavor and tenderness of meat have much to do with its digestibility and consequently with its real value as a food.—London Lancet.

Earthenware Stewpans.

Stewpans and baking dishes of heavy glazed earthenware are more cumbersome than the convenient agate, but where long, slow cooking is desired they are very necessary. The humble earthen stewpan with close cover forms a substitute for the French casserole, and meat cooked properly in it reaches a fullness of flavor and nutritive value never approached by the same piece when cooked rapidly in a thin metal saucepan. An elderly hen slowly cooked in the earthen vessel with appropriate seasoning is a vast improvement over any other mode of cooking, and cereals long boiled in a similar vessel reach a wholesome palatability that is missing in many of our three minute breakfast foods.

German Potato Salad.

Sour potatoes are a favorite dish of potato salad with the Germans. To make it, boil four good sized potatoes and when cold skin and cut in cubes. Place in a bowl with salt and pepper to taste. Mix in another bowl four tablespoonfuls of sweet cider vinegar, half a pint of sweet oil, one good sized onion and parsley chopped fine. Mix well and pour over the potatoes. Then place the empty bowl over the other and shake up and down till well mixed. Garnish with lemon slices and pickled beets.

Cuts Better Than a Knife.

A fine strong wire is the best thing we know of to cut bars of soap, and the same improvised tool will cut a whole cheese in half very nicely, far better than a knife. The wire should be long enough to go around the cheese and have each end attached to a handle. The wire is looped around the cheese and firmly pulled, the two ends together; the cheese will be cut in half very cleanly.

When Using Sour Milk.

When sour milk is to be used in cooking, a few vigorous whisks with the egg beater in the bowl or pitcher will mix the curd and whey so thoroughly that it can be poured as easily as cream and will obviate the unpleasantness of finding the cakes or muffins interspersed with particles of curd. Soda used with sour milk should not be put into the milk, but be sifted into the flour like baking powder.

For "Squeaky" Shoes.

A remedy for creaking shoe soles is to allow the soles to stand overnight in a pan containing a small quantity of olive oil, so that they will become saturated with it. This will protect them from dampness, and if the soles are carefully wiped off they will not grease carpets or rugs. This treatment is especially intended for walking shoes.

Carpets and Oilcloths.

Never use soda in water with which oilcloth or linoleum is washed. It attacks the paint and injures it. Equal parts of cottonseed oil and vinegar, rubbed on with a flannel rag, seem to brighten linoleum. Carpets are brightened by wiping with a cloth wrung out of warm water and ammonia.

A Hot Sand Bag.

A hot sand bag is a desirable substitute for a hot water bag or a soapstone, whether to relieve pain or to warm cold feet. Clean, fine sand is thoroughly dried, then used to fill a flannel bag, which is then covered with firm cotton or linen. The bag is heated on the top of the stove or in the oven.
