

THINNING FRUIT.

It Makes It Larger and Fuller and Preserves the Tree.

The practice of thinning fruit has long been known to the fruit grower in Europe, and of years in fruit with us are almost unknown. Of late years the practice has been taken up by most of our successful fruit growers, and the consensus of opinion is that thinning pays well. The most successful grower nowadays is not the one who raises the largest quantity of peaches or apples, but the one who produces the finest and highest quality of fruit. Superior fruit cannot be obtained from a tree that is overloaded with fruit. The capacity of a tree is limited, and it cannot be exceeded no matter how many fruits may be set. If many fruits are set and are allowed to remain, the energies of the tree are spread out over the greater number, and few if any will reach the limit of their possible growth. If, on the other hand, one-half or two-thirds of the young fruits are removed, the remaining ones will have an opportunity to develop to a normal size. Moreover, the vitality of the tree is greatly preserved by such reduction, since it is not the size of the fruit that impairs the vitality of the tree, but the number of seeds which are allowed to mature. By removing one-half or more of the young fruits we do not only make it possible for the tree to produce a larger and finer fruit, but we also preserve the vigor and longevity of the tree.

Judicious thinning makes it possible in many cases to produce a crop of fruit every year and still keep the tree in better state of health. Thinning also tends to produce better colored fruit, as it permits the sun to reach many of the places which would otherwise be reached. It also permits a freer circulation of the air, thus lessening the danger of infection by contact with the fruit. It prevents the breaking down of the trees and tends to keep the shape of the trees in orchards more uniform.—E. P. Sandsten, Maryland.
