A neighbor had offered him eighty-five cents on the dollar for it, and after trying all the "brokers" around town he failed to get an advance on this offer and carried it back home with him. It the claim had been less than \$100 he could not have received more than eighty cents on the dollar for it. The county of Abbeville can certainly pay more than eighty-five cents on the dollar upon its indebtedness, and the pride and position of our county justifies its citi-zens in demanding of its financial agents the said clerk of council within ten days after written notice of his appointment to file with the intendant of the town of Abbeville a that this matter be improved.

Really it is not as much as 85 per cent. Every man who bids upon a contract for any work let out by the County Commissioners, if he is a man of ordinary shrewdyess, adds to his bid the 15 per cent. that he will have to pay to the broker who buys his claim at a discount, and at least 5 or 10 per cent. in addition to cover all the incidental risks attaching to the collection of the amounts due. 
