Wide Awake People of the Carolinas Send in Nominations for Themselves and Friends — Price List Attracts Very Best People.

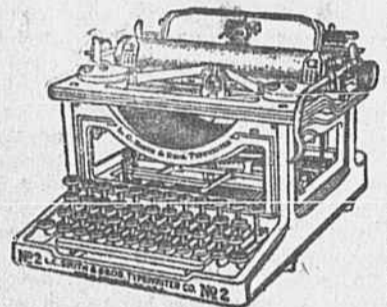
Contestants Demand Full Information and Apply in Large Numbers for Books — Automobile Attracts Special Attention

Only two short days have elapsed since the first announcement of The Anderson Daily Intelligencer's plans to give away approximately \$20,000 worth of valuable prizes to the energetic people of the Carolinas, and already wonderful interest has been manifested in this Contest. Nominations continue to come from all quarters and there is evidence by phone and mail that the greatest interest is being felt in the city of Anderson and county. All day yesterday, The Contest Department presented a scene of activity unusual so early in a Contest of this kind. Many persons living in Anderson and the immediate vicinity called in person, while others used both telephone and letters. Candidates and prospective candidates brought out several points yesterday that need special explanation and answers. The most important question asked was: "What do I have to do to win?" 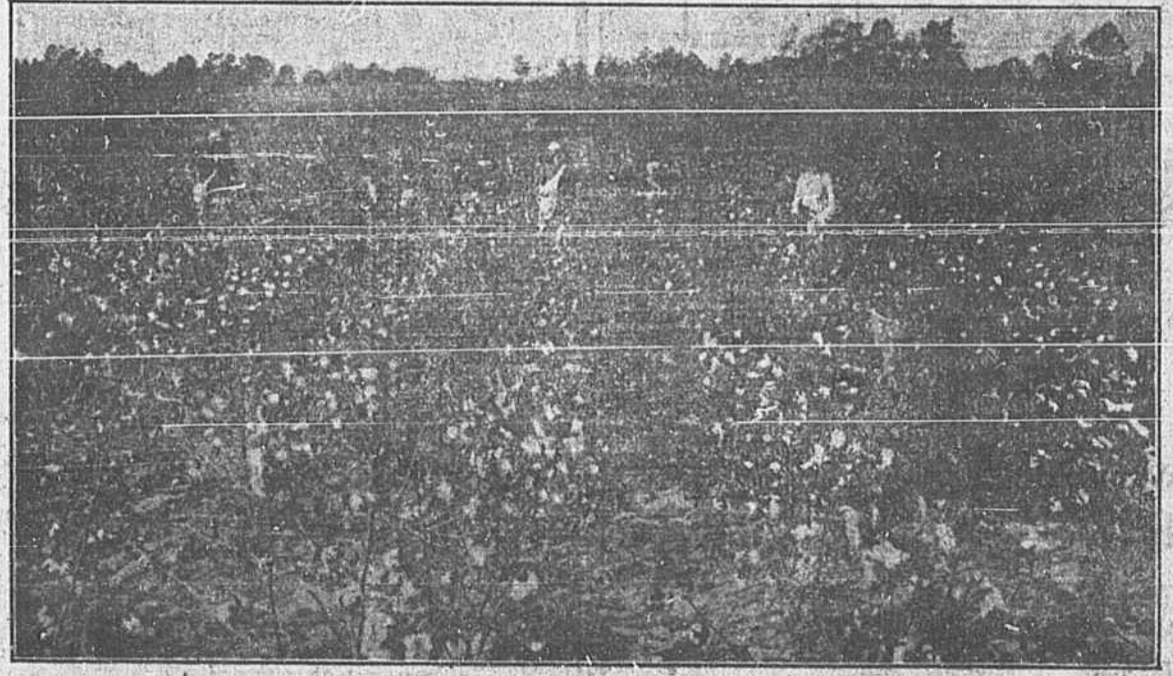
