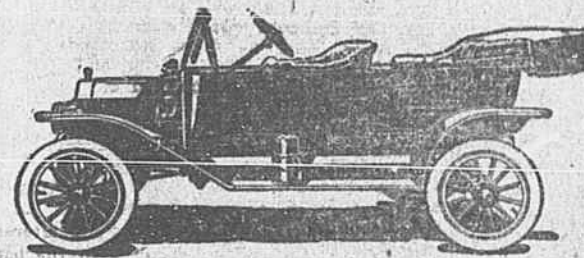
RULES OF CONTEST

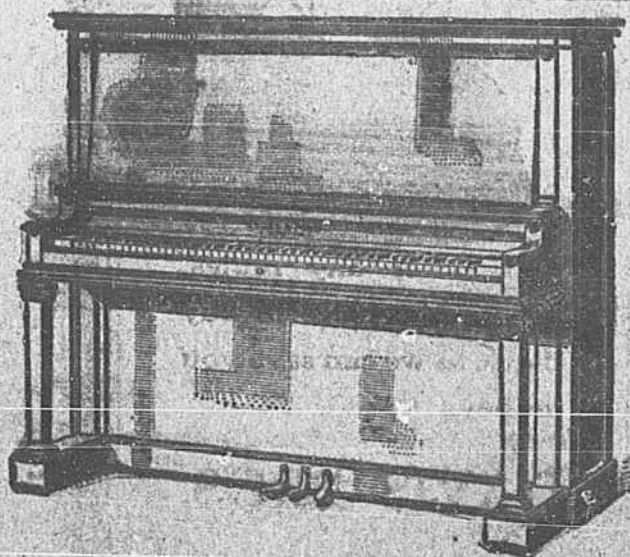

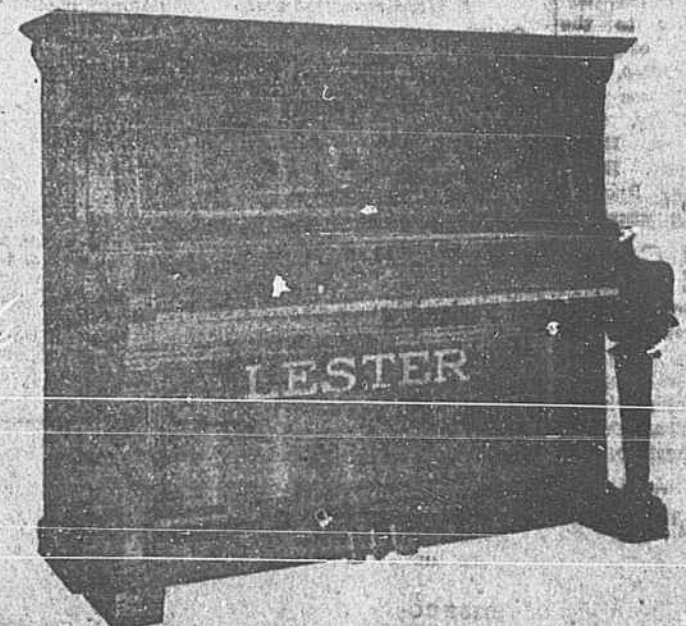

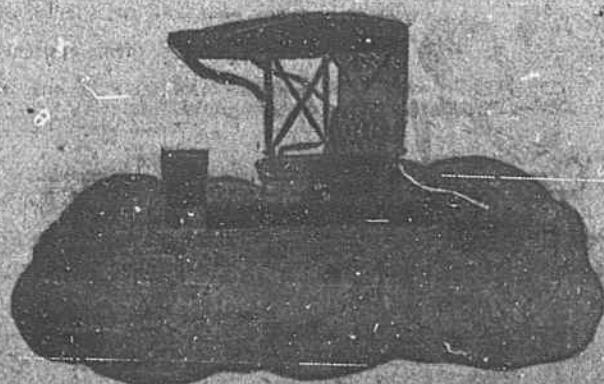
