New Orleans Cotton

New Orleans, Feb. 12.—The cotton market today was dull up to the last hour of business when buying in volume came in and prices edged sharply, following revision of spot quotations. Middling was advanced one eighth. At 2 o'clock the market stood 1 to 5 points up from this there was a rise to a level ten to twelve points up on the old crop. The close was a net gain of 8 to 11 points, both crops considered.

While the earlier part of the day was dull the undertone was steady as the result of bullish cables and reports from Texas points of good demand for export. Spot cotton steady, revised. Middling, 1-8c up at 12:15-16. Sales on the spot 1,250 bales to arrive, 1,025. Cotton futures closing: February, 12.27; March, 12.56; May, 12.87; July, 12.99; August, 12.73; October, 11.63.

Liverpool Cotton

Liverpool, Feb. 12.—Cotton Spot in fair demand, prices barely steady; good middling, 7.34. Sales, 8,000, including 7,700 American. Receipts, 1,400 including 500 American. Futures closed steady: Feb-March 6.64; March-April 6.69; June-July 6.69; Sept-October 6.81; Nov-December 6.19.

THE DAY IN CONGRESS

(By Associated Press) Senate

Met at noon. John G. Millburn testified on the bill to regulate stock exchanges before banking committee. Passed Senator Smoot's bill to open withdraw Alaska coal lands to homestead entry, reserving title to the coal to the government.

Immigration committee decided on a speedy report on the Burnett immigration bill. Senator Bradley of Kentucky read Lincoln's Gettysburg address. Adjourned at 4:20 p. m. in observance of Lincoln's birthday, to noon Friday.

House

Met at noon. Set time aside for Lincoln memorial speeches. Democrats of the immigration committee prevented consideration of Asiatic exclusion bills.

Rural credits hearings arranged for next week by a subcommittee. Representative Russell, Missouri, read from the speaker's rostrum Lincoln's Gettysburg address and Representative Feun of Ohio delivered an oration on Lincoln.

District of Columbia legislation considered. Representative Capron, New York, introduced bill for 1907, 1908 to change New York assay office. Representative Kinkead of New Jersey, introduced bill to provide for experts and special agent to develop commerce with Central and South America and for to send attaches of the state department to investigate manufacturing and trade conditions of foreign countries.

Passed bill to authorize president to participate in international conference on phytopathology at Rome this month. Adjourned at 5:32 p. m. until Friday.

Atlanta, Ga., Feb. 12.—S. M. McKendree, today found dead in a Charlotte hotel, was to have been married on next Sunday to Miss Rosa Blinfield of Rockmart, Ga. He was widely known here.
