Lesson by the Way.

Luke 13:18-35.

Financial and Commercial

New York Cotton

Old crop shorts showed renewed nervousness in cotton today and demand sent cotton into new high ground for the movements. Reaction followed an early advance; but the market firmed up again with the close at a net gain of 23 points on March, and 4 to 10 points on later months. March closed at 21 points over May; while May showed a premium of about 25 points over July contracts. The report of the cotton bureau on spinning appeared to be about in line with the average expectations and was not an important factor.

New Orleans Cotton

New Orleans, La., March 20.—The census bureau count of the crop of 13,924,991 bales caused a buying wave in the cotton market today which put the trading month 13 to 18 points over yesterday's close. The close was at a net gain for the day of 9 to 15 points.

Liverpool Cotton

Liverpool, March 20.—Cotton spot steady; good middling 750; middling 708; low middling 668. Sales 7,600; speculation and export 660. Receipts 26,000. Futures barely steady.

Cotton Seed Oil

New York, March 20.—Cotton seed oil advanced sharply today on active coverings for shorts, prompted by the strength of the March proposition and scarcity of crude offerings, somewhat better consumptive demand and aggressive support from the professional element, but reacted slightly under
