Anderson Panies Receive Draft Of Principal Changes Made For the State

Following a request made by Lee G Helleman, Anderson banks and bank era have received from B. H. Moss, at for the South Carolina Banking Accordation, an outline of the changes made in the banking laws of the state by the general negotiable lastrument act passed by the feet general assembly of South Carolina. For the benefit of the Intelligencer readers the outline furnished by Mr. Moss is herewith reproduced:

"The following are the principal General Negotiable Instrument cent Act enacted at the recent session of the General Assembly, this opinion being propared at the request of the President and Secretary of the South Carolina Eankers' Association. To Bankers of the State of South Car-

Act passed gives South Carolina uni-torn laws on the sale of Negrichic Instruments with the various States of the Union. The new Act takes effect on the 25th day of March 1914.

The important changes are as fol-

lows:

1. Days of grace are abolished.

2. A more under seal is made n 2. A note under seal is made nego-lable, provided the instrument is othsrwise regotiable. 3. It surkes acquilable instru drawe with exchange costs of collection on attorney's fees, provided the instriment is otherwise regotiable.

4. It changes the rule which here-tofore operated as an assignment protunt of gauds of a drawer of a check of the country.
