YEASTBREAD FOR PLANTING IN YARDS

Clemson College, April 15.—With the farmer the planting of the principal field crops has begun, and should not be delayed in any way.

There are several important vegetables which should be planted in April, such as cucumbers, eggplants, okra, corn, cauliflower, sprouts, tomatoes, and beans of various kinds.

Season Tickets for Our Forthcoming Redpath Chautauqua

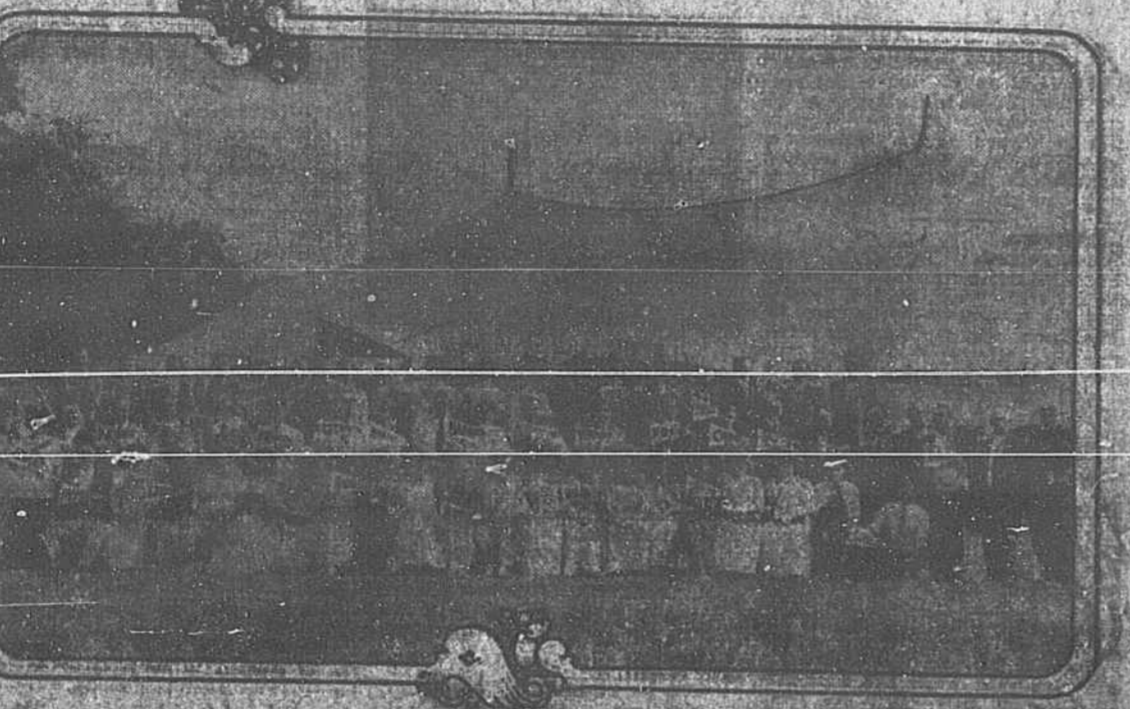

For the Next Trades Day To Be Given By the Anderson Chamber of Commerce

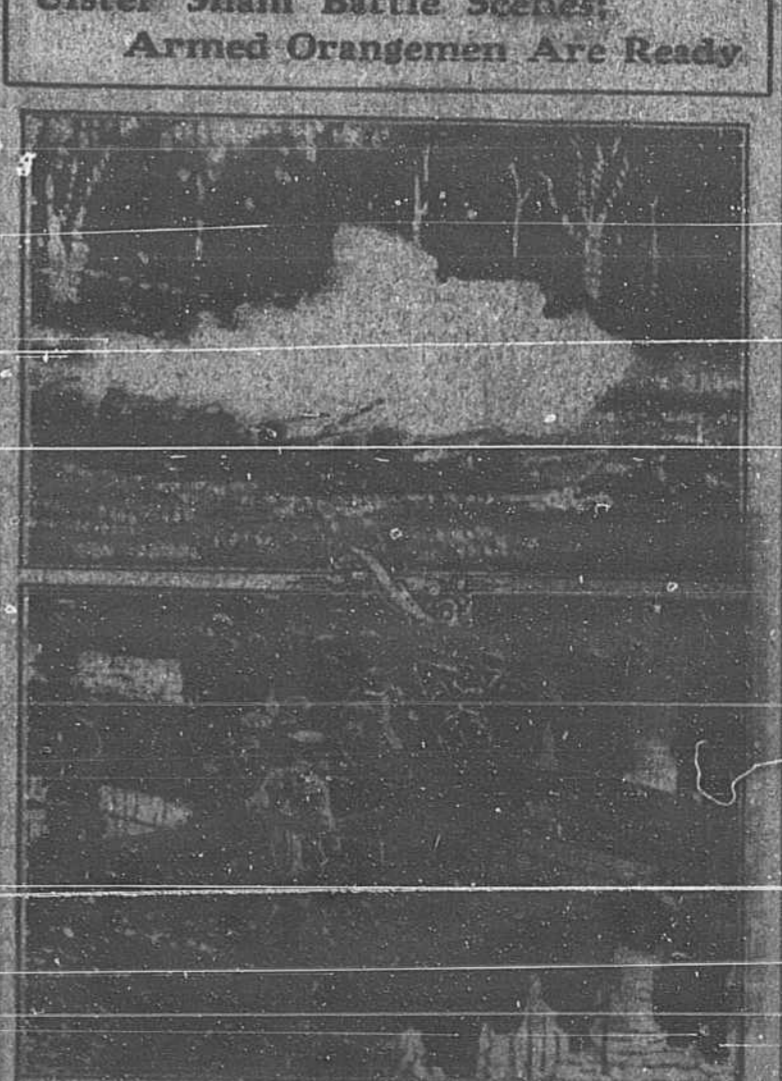
