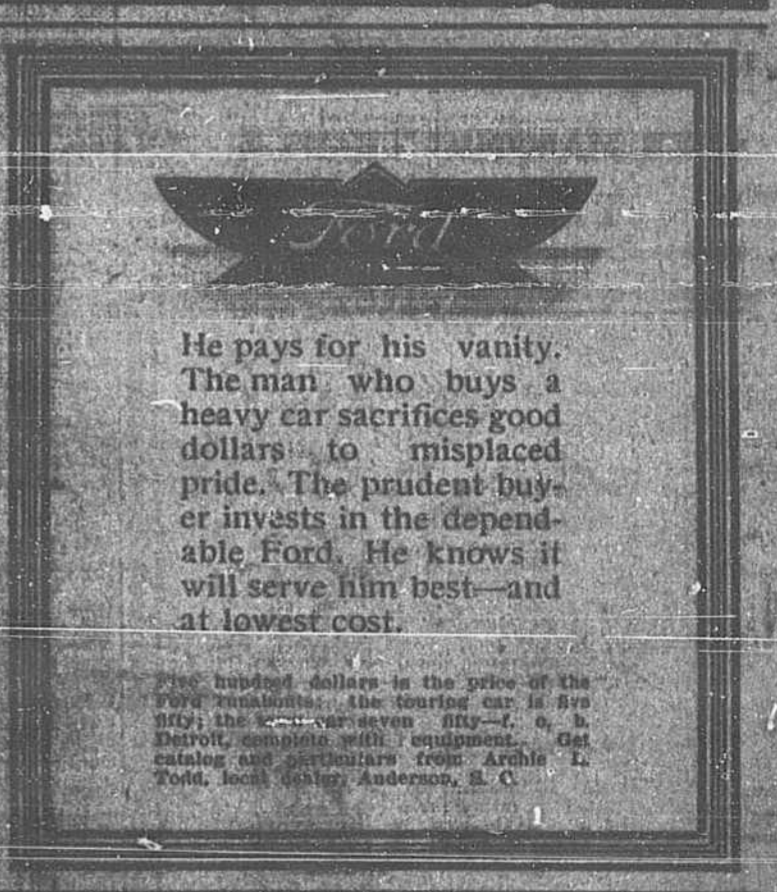
Governor Elliott, Says He Has Nothing To Do Whatever With Band Proposition
