THE COUNTY CONVENTION MET; EVERYTHING WAS HARMONIOUS

GEN. M. L. BONHAM AGAIN ELECTED PRESIDENT OF THE CONVENTION AND S. DEAN PEARMAN COUNTY CHAIRMAN; DELEGATES TO THE STATE CONVENTION.

The county democratic convention met Monday and was entirely harmonious. All of the delegates were present, something like 450 being enrolled.

Upon the roll of clubs being called, the roll was perfected. Two new clubs were received, one at White Plains and one at Campbell's store.

Gen. M. L. Bonham called the meeting to order and made a ringing speech for harmony, stating that the president of the United States is a Southerner man, the national administration is southern and democratic and the State of South Carolina should be in close touch with the national party.

Capt. H. H. Watkins nominated Dr. Tripp as vice president of the convention. This was received with enthusiasm and Dr. Tripp was elected unanimously.

Gen. M. L. Bonham was elected secretary without opposition. The roll of the county executive committee was then formed, and S. Dean Pearman was elected chairman. Gen. Bonham had already announced that he could not serve.

Gen. J. W. Ashley was put in nomination but withdrew his name as a member of the state executive committee and Dr. Frank Watkins was elected to the position without opposition.

For delegates to the state convention the following were nominated: J. Clyde Green, U. E. Seydt, D. A. Taylor, J. C. Scribbling, W. A. Tripp, S. O. Jackson, S. D. Pearman, A. S. Faut, C. E. Harper, L. L. Rice, W. W. Scott, B. J. Pearman, J. B. Ham-

mond, J. M. Broyles, Samuel McCrory, W. P. Bell, G. M. Rice, W. M. Howard, J. B. South, H. E. Polk. The election was written ballot.

While this was taking place, Executive J. K. Head offered resolutions endorsing Woodrow Wilson and instructing the delegates to the state convention to support a resolution urging our senators to stand up for the president's policy on the shipping tolls question.

The convention took a recess while the ballots were being counted and it was decided that no further business could be transacted as many members had to catch trains. The matter of primary regulations did not come up at all.

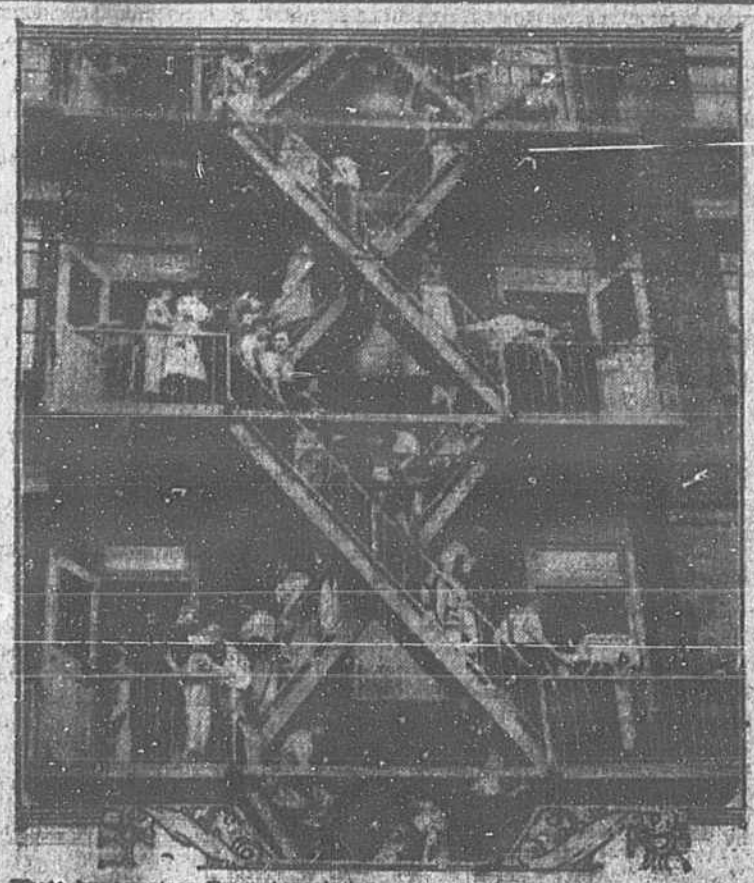
