WESTMINSTER TO GET TWO NEW TRAINS

Nos. 41 and 42 to Change Southern Terminus At An Early Date

Westminster, May 6.—According to the news given out by the railroad officials, Southern trains Nos. 41 and 42 will soon extend their service to Westminster instead of making Seneca the terminus. Frank H. Shirley, member of the legislature from the county and secretary of the Westminster Board of Trade, was one of the leading workers in having the trains run to Westminster. As the directing head of the board of trade he has been working faithfully for some months, and recently carried his plans before the state railroad commission. The Southern recently told the Westminster board of trade that if the land for certain side tracks were given them by the town, the service would be extended to Westminster. It is understood that the land was furnished by public spirited citizens of the town at a cost of about \$2,000. The board of trade will now make an effort to get the "Bell" train, running between Atlanta and Toccoa, Ga., run to Westminster. To have trains Nos. 41 and 42 run from Westminster to Charlotte will be a great convenience to the people of Westminster. With the additional service they will be able to come to Seneca in the early morning and there catch train No. 29 to Atlanta or the Blue Ridge to Anderson. No. 41 will reach Westminster about 11 o'clock at night.

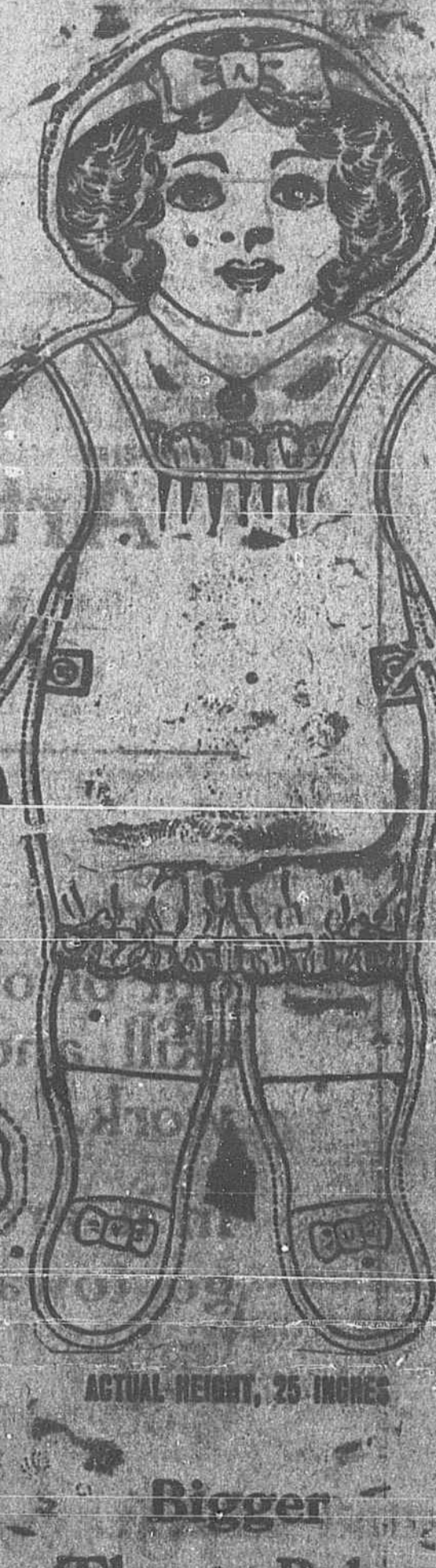

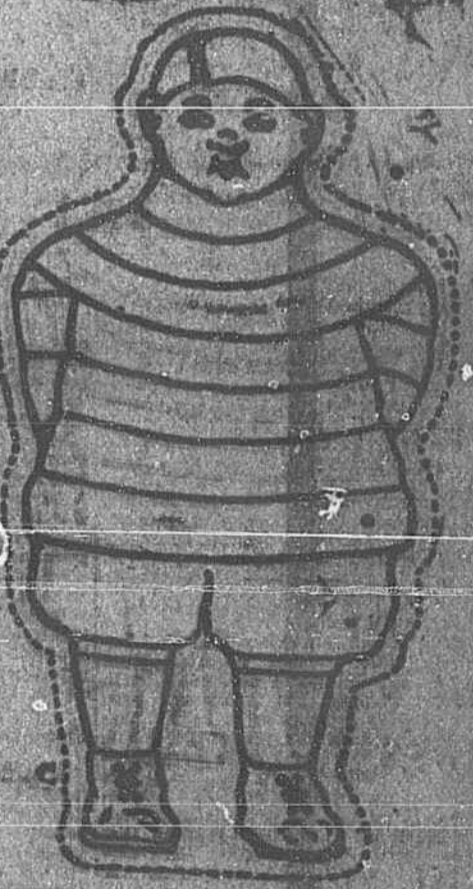
