COTTON GOES UP ACCOUNT OF RAIN

Bulk Buying on New Orleans and Other Markets Boosts All Grades

New York, May 7.—The cotton market was very quiet today but ruled generally steady and closed at a net advance of from 1 to 7 points. Private reports that it was raining at two or three Texas points may have helped the market during the afternoon, but there seemed to be a feeling abroad the local ring that they have been of no great extent, as the early forecasts were for generally fair weather tonight and tomorrow.

Advices continued to come, in however, complaining of recent excessive rainfall in the southwest and indicating that a considerable amount of dry weather would be necessary in some sections before farm work is resumed.

New Orleans Cotton

New Orleans, May 7.—The contract market reported an advance today of 13 points on May and 7 to 7 1/2 points on other old crop months, and 11 points on September and 5 to 6 points on other new crop positions.

STOCKS RANGE IS RESTRICTED

Chicago and Northwestern Road Announces Sale of \$5 Million Loan; Others to Follow

New York, May 7.—The narrow and variable movements of stocks today had little effect on the general level of prices. The market was as dull and flat as during yesterday's session and traders made no attempts to force it out of the groove in which it has traveled for several days.

Quotations moved alternately up and down, ending with small losses. Low-don cables quoted low prices for international shares of a reported falling in that market for Paris and New York. Taking their cue from this quarter, traders made experiments of various and succeeded in uncovering a few weak spots. Shares which recently have been heavy such as North Pacific, Missouri Pacific and Chesapeake and Ohio were most susceptible to pressure.
