## PRESIDENT TELLS U. S. ENVOYS HUERTA MUST BE ELIMINATED

### FIRST TWO OF MEDIATORS ARE WELCOMED TO DO MAIN OF CANADA BY THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT

#### Formal Conference Looking to Settlement of Mexican Trouble Without Further War Will Begin at Niagara Falls In Short Time—Participants Confident of Outcome

(By Associated Press)  
Washington, May 18.—President Wilson today told the American commissioners who left last night for the mediation conference at Niagara Falls, Ontario, that the United States government regards the settlement of the Mexican problem in a definite form as a prerequisite to the withdrawal of the American forces from Vera Cruz.

No Haters for Americans.  
The president gave the American commissioners—Justice Lamar of the supreme court of the United States; Frederick Lehmann, former solicitor general and diplomatic secretary; H. P. Davis, former secretary of the treasury; and the duke of Connaught, who is to place themselves in a receptive mood and await proposals from the three South American mediators.

Huerta Elimination Next.  
But at the same time he outlined to his representatives that success in the settlement is to be conditioned on the elimination of the Huerta administration, and the establishment in its place of a provisional government which would conduct an election giving fair treatment to all factions.

Huerta Ready to Quit.  
The president also said that he is confident that the Huerta administration is one of the things that will be eliminated.

From a diplomatic source in Mexico City stating that General Huerta was ready to resign and would permit his representatives to attend the mediation conference to eliminate him if it should become absolutely necessary. Huerta's resignation since their arrival to this country showed that they had realized Huerta's elimination was regarded as essential to the settlement and knew from the outset that unless they came prepared to deal with this phase of the problem their efforts would be fruitless.

They are said to be ready to recommend Huerta's resignation but only on the condition that definite understanding is reached on the kind of government that is to follow.

### HIS "PAL" WENT ON WITNESS STAND YESTERDAY AGAINST HIM

#### SPRUNG SURPRISE AGAINST ROMANISM

## MAKE PROTEST AS TO TUMULTY

### SOUTHERN BAPTISTS DE-CLARE AGAINST "REPRESENTATIVE VATICAN"

#### Object To the President of the United States Attending Service in Catholic Church

Nashville, Tenn., May 18.—At its final session today the Southern Baptist Convention adopted resolutions protesting against a representative of the vatican being at the American seat of government. The resolutions set forth that 2,500,000 Southern Baptists viewed with alarm the disposition of governmental representatives to give sanction to the Catholic church by attending their services and official functions.

## ROASTS BURNS FROM BENCH

### JUDGE HILL OF GEORGIA PLAINLY ABOUT THE FAMOUS "SLUETH"

#### STRONG CRITICISM OF THE METHODS EMPLOYED TO GET INFORMATION IN THE CELEBRATED LEO M. FRANK CASE

Atlanta, May 18.—Inquiry into methods used in obtaining evidence in connection with the extraordinary motion for a new trial for Leo M. Frank was directed here today by Superior Judge Benjamin H. Hill in instructing the Fulton county grand jury.

The course followed by "certain detectives" in the case of the factory superintendent under sentence of death for the murder of Mary Phagan, the fourteen-year-old factory girl, were severely criticized by Judge Hill. He characterized the work of these famous "slueths" as "an obstruction to the administration of justice."

"I doubt the wisdom of allowing detectives from another state to come here and criticize our officers and our courts. We have no room here for such men—men who come posing as seeking the truth when they are only seeking notoriety."

The court told the jury that various witnesses in the case had repudiated the testimony given by them at the trial of Frank and that some later had made more repudiations. Investigation into the charges of bribery and frauds that were made in connection with these statements was asked.

The hearing on the motion to set aside the Frank verdict today was postponed by Judge Hill until Saturday. The postponement was granted upon request by attorneys from both sides. The motion is based upon the claim that the constitutional right of a fair trial was not present in court when the verdict was returned.

Washington, May 18.—Senator Sulzberg of Utah, declared in the senate today that it is history of free government, no such astounding proposition ever before had been presented to a great legislative body as the demand of President Wilson that the congress should repeal the espionage law "without raising the question whether we were right or wrong."
