OSTRICH FARM HAS NOW BECOME A CERTAINTY

PLAN TO TRY THIS COUNTY FOR BREEDING

WILL ORDER BIRDS Those Behind Venture Say That It Will Prove Paying Investment For Anderson County

When Anderson people read in The Intelligencer a few weeks ago that an ostrich farm for this county was a probability many doubted the statement and a few scoffed at the idea.

It must be admitted that the ostrich industry is very attractive and the local people who are beginning on the birds say that they can realize enough from the sale of tickets to see the birds to pay the first cost.

Following a letter of inquiry, the boarders of the birds wrote the following letter to the man who had purchased two of the birds for Anderson.

"In answer to yours of the 22nd, our prices on thoroughbred South African Nubian ostriches 3 years old or older, is \$150 per pair, F. O. B. Charleston, Arizona.

We delivered a pair of birds to the New York Zoological Park, here in this city, and to the Lincoln Park in Chicago. We have this morning received an order for another pair to be shipped to the New York Zoological Park.

We can see no reason why ostrich farming should not be a paying industry in South Carolina. The birds breed rapidly and are in full production at 2 years of age.

The birds which have arrived at the Bronx Park in this city, came through in perfect condition. We trust that you will place an order for at least a pair of ostriches, which will receive our prompt attention."

SOON TO START ALL MACHINERY

Generator No. 2 Went Into Use At Pendleton and Now No. 1 Is Almost Ready.

It was announced yesterday by the officials of the water and light company that generator No. 2 at Pendleton Shoups, a 1500 kilowatt machine, had been put into use yesterday morning and was running in good condition.

The officials also said that they planned to have generator No. 1 completed and ready for use during the latter part of the week and that it would probably be put to work by Friday. This will mean that all the machinery, seriously damaged by the explosion some time ago, has been replaced and repaired and when No. 1 goes to work all the machinery of the plant will again be working.
