Financial and Commercial

Liverpool Cotton

Liverpool, Aug. 3.—Directors of the Liverpool cotton association at a meeting today resolved that the cotton exchange be closed indefinitely. A resolution also was passed declaring that until further notice all trading in futures and all tenders and settlements for futures contracts shall be suspended and that until arrangements to safeguard the interests of all concerned be made no trading in spot cotton shall be allowed.

Cotton Seed Oil

New York, Aug. 3.—The cotton seed oil exchange did not open today. Business may be resumed tomorrow, but the exchange may remain closed long if it is deemed wise.

Grain & Provisions

Chicago, Aug. 3.—War developments today jolted provisions prices down. Losses at the end of trading ran from 57 1/2 to 17 1/2, as compared with Saturday night. Shipments of hard exports to Europe was immediately responsible, coupled with the tightening of finances. Corn fell with provisions, the September delivery closing on 1-4 to 5-8 down. Wheat declined 1-4 to 1 1/4 not and oats 5-8 to 1 3/4c.

THE DAY IN CONGRESS

Washington, August 3. SENATE—Senator Gallagher introduced a bill "deeply depreciating" the European war and expressing hope for its speedy end.

Banking committee finished its examination of Paul W. Warburg, nominated for the Federal reserve board. Bill for special coin to commemorate the San Francisco Exposition was passed.

The president was authorized to invite foreign delegates to the International Dry Farming congress at Wichita, Kansas.

Passed resolution appropriating \$250,000 for relief of Americans abroad.

Recessed at 6:18 p. m., to 11 a. m. Tuesday.

Emergency legislation removing restrictions of currency and American registration of ocean ships was taken up.

Passed the bill removing restrictions on foreign ships seeking American registration.

Passed resolution appropriating \$250,000 for relief of Americans who are abroad.

Passed bill for temporary relief of locators of oil and gas lands in California, to regulate interstate transportation of immature calves and to provide for patents for public lands claimed under homestead laws by deserted wives.

Adjourned at 5:20 p. m. until 11 a. m. Tuesday.

ITALY SHORT OF COAL

Rome, Aug. 2.—The war situation so far as Italy is concerned, was considered more grave today. The censorship has suppressed all news except a colorless statement that Italy will not mobilize, but will conform to her conduct to the treaty obligations. This statement is interpreted differently here. According to some it means the neutrality of Italy while others believe Italy will participate in the conflict only in case the Central powers sustain a reverse.

Apprehension is felt at the lack of coal for the navy owing to Italy's entirely being entirely dependent upon England. Efforts are being made to secure American coal.

FORTNER ARRESTED

(Charged With Being Drunk and Disorderly.)

Columbia, August 3.—J. D. Fortner of Spartanburg, candidate for railroad commissioner, was arrested Friday night by the city police on the charge of drunk and disorderly conduct and carried to the police station, where he left a bond of \$75 for his appearance in court. Mr. Fortner failed to appear and his bond was forfeited.

According to information contained in the police records Fortner was found drunk and acting in a disorderly manner in the club room of William Poa, called the Arlington club, 1315 Main street. The arrest was made by Officer S. F. Strickland, assisted by Officer S. S. Shorter.

It is understood that Fortner, when arrested produced a commission as constable signed by Governor Bleas and declared that as a constable he could not be arrested. He was carried to the station, however, notwithstanding this protest.

Fortner has been for the past two seasons a member of the house of representatives from Spartanburg.
