For the legislature, Boyd, Lee and Arnold, anti-administration have been chosen; second race between Query, Lyles and Zimmerman, anti, and Wsche, Rogers, Mosely, Foster and Kirby, Bleasettes.

The race for state senator is close and exciting, with Mr. Sherard ahead, but the chances favoring Mr. Summers.
