PROTESTS OF PRESS ARE RECOGNIZED

Censorship May Be Made Much Less Stringent On All War News

London, August 27.—Protests by British papers against the censorship and against the country being kept in darkness about military operations received attention at Premier Asquith's hands tonight. Replying to a suggestion by James Hogg, M. P., in the house of commons that trained journalists be put in charge of the censorship, the premier said: "The government and military authorities recognize the strain placed on the public by the scarcity of the information from the front, and they will do all in their power to relieve it. The principle on which information is given to the public is that all information which can be given without prejudice to the public interests will be given fully and at once. This has, and will be done."

The premier explained that the official press bureau has access for consultative purposes to Earl Kitchener, secretary for war, and Winston Spencer Churchill, first lord of the admiralty, and in case of doubt, to the premier. A consultation between the heads of the departments and a press committee has resulted in the decision that it was not desirable to add journalism to the staff of the bureau, but that they should be associated with the staff of cable censors. "Steps are being taken," said the premier, "to carry this out and to possess the principles on which the censorship of cables and other press information respectively is carried out. The difficulty in defining general standards is not believed to be insuperable, though it is evidently great. "Every effort will be made to consult the legitimate expectations of the press and public and to harmonize with these naval and military considerations."

that the fighting has been on a front twenty miles along the line between Cambrai and LeCateau and between the rivers Scheldt and Sambre, while the Germans have been steadily attempting an outflanking movement by forced marches. The allies have the advantage of working on interior lines and have been falling back in the interests of concentration. The Russians appear to be steadily advancing in East Prussia. They are approaching the great fortress of Koentzenburg and have crossed the river Alle at several points. While they continue their advance, with Posen as their objective they are confronting the Austrians between the Dniester and the Vistula and claim a number of victories along that line. The Austrians assert that they have defeated the Russians in a six day battle near Kronin, Russian Poland, repulsing them decisively over the entire front of about 43 miles. A dozen battles are being fought around a great wall of German and Austrian bayonets all of which will be considered milestones of history in less overwhelming days.

The sinking of the Kaiser Wilhelm der Gross by a British cruiser and the loss of the German cruiser Magdeburg are episodes in the chronicle of a day. The British public is becoming restive under the suspense. The newspapers are beginning to demand a loosening of the censorship, while women through the war office for word as to whether their husbands and sons are among the 2,000 British dead and wounded of the last week's fighting.
