**European War Bulletins;  
Latest News of All The  
Important Happenings**

While the latest official statements give few details of the great battle being waged in France, in which 3,000,000 men are engaged, it seems apparent that the German forces are still falling back, from the announcement that the allies have gained about 37 miles of territory in their advance, an increase of twelve in the past 24 hours operations.

Both British and French troops have crossed the river Marne, the British capturing men and guns. The action of greatest severity is being fought between Maily and Vitry-Le Francois.

In an engagement between British and Germans in Nyassa Land, British Central Africa, the Germans, who according to the British official press bureau, were driven back to the river Songwe, which is part of the frontier between the British and German protectorates.

Prince Joachim Albrecht, of Prussia, son of the late Prince Frederick Albert, regent of Brunswick, and a second cousin of the German emperor has been wounded in battle.

Both the German and allies armies in France are being reinforced and the battle in France is likely to last some days yet.

Reports concerning the progress of the Russian and Austrian arms are meager, but a Petrograd dispatch says it is believed the German crown prince has been appointed chief commander of the forces which are to oppose the Russian advance.

Pope Benedict XV in an encyclical to the episcopacy of the world urges peace and brotherhood among the nations. In this encyclical the pope says:

"We exhort most earnestly those who govern the destiny of the nations that they should bring themselves to a frame of mind whereby they may put aside all dissensions contrary to the welfare of humanity."

The British prime minister has called for more men to serve the country.

Additional British casualties have been made public, covering the period up to September 7, and bringing the total for the campaign close to 19,000 killed wounded and missing.

**Russians Attack Fortress.**

London, September 10.—3.20 a. m.—A dispatch to the Post from Copenhagen states that reports have been received there from Stettin that the Russians are bombarding Koenigsberg, the strong German fortress in East Prussia, and that part of the city is in flames.

**Crown Prince Will Oppose Russia.**

London, September 11.—12.40 a. m.—According to a Petrograd dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company, it is believed there that the German crown prince has been appointed commander-in-chief of the forces against Russia.

**Belgians Vs. Germans.**

London, September 10.—9.20 p. m.—A Reuter dispatch from Ostend says that according to soldiers who have arrived there it would appear that an engagement is in progress between the Belgians and Germans who are withdrawing towards France.

**Belgians Win a Victory.**

Rotterdam, via London, September 10.—7.09 p. m.—A dispatch to the Courant dated Breda, Holland, reports that a heavy engagement took place Wednesday at Aerschot, Belgium, nine miles northeast of Louvain, when the Belgians attacked the garrison there.

As a result of the fighting the Germans evacuated the town, and the Belgians hoisted their colors and liberated 26 priests found in a church.

**Germans Driven Back.**

Paris, September 10.—11.16 p. m.—"During the four days' battle," says an official communication issued tonight, "the allies have pushed back the Germans sixty kilometers (approximately 37 miles) and taken many prisoners and machine guns."

**Assisted in Rescue.**

Aberdeen, via London, September 10.—8.15 p. m.—The trawler Glenogil, which has arrived here, reports having assisted in the rescue of the crew of the White Star Liner Oceanic, wrecked off the coast of Scotland, and in transferring them to another ship. An attempt to refloat the Oceanic, which had struck a rock, failed when the hull parted and the attempt was abandoned.

**Belgians Flooding Country.**

London, Sep. 10.—10.17 p. m.—An official dispatch issued in Berlin and received here tonight by the Marconia Company says: "In an engagement at Oordoghem, on the railway between Antwerp and Ghent, the Belgian troops withdrew."

"The country south of Antwerp has been flooded by the Belgians to prevent the Germans marching into the town. The area covered by the flood is seventy square miles. The water varies in depth at different places from a few inches to several feet."

**French Version of Fighting.**

Paris, Sept. 10.—12.22 p. m.—The following official communication was issued tonight:

"On the left wing the British and French troops have crossed the Marne between La Ferté-Sous-Jouarre, Charly and Chateau Thierry, pursuing the enemy, who is in retreat. During the course of this advance the British forces took a number of prisoners and capturing Mitralleuses."

"During the four days' battles the allied armies have in that section of the theatre of operations gained more than sixty kilometers."

"Between Chateau Thierry and Vitry-Le-Francois the Prussian road has been thrown back."

**TURKEY WANTS TO JOIN FIGHT**

the national sentiment of her people and is ready to seize any difficulties that may arise with Great Britain as a pretext to declare war.

The Turkish ambassador made known his government's action in a public announcement after it had been communicated to Secretary Bryan today as a formal note from the Ottoman empire. The announcement reads:

A cablegram to the Turkish ambassador from the Ottoman minister of foreign affairs states that by imperial trade the Ottoman government has abrogated, as from the first of October next, the conventions known as the capitulations restricting the sovereignty of Turkey in her relations with certain powers.

"All privileges and immunities accessory to these conventions or issuing therefrom are equally repealed, having thus freed itself from an intolerable obstacle to all progress in the empire, the imperial government has adopted as a basis of its relations with the other powers the general principles of international law."

In announcing receipt of the cablegram, the Turkish ambassador said, "this war is Turkey's opportunity."

As early as 1665, the sovereign Constantinople granted charters of extra-territorial privileges, called capitulations. The Venetians first were granted the right to trial by judges appointed in Venice and permanently residing in Constantinople. When the young Turks gained control, the powers were sounded as to possible abrogation of the capitulations. The reply was unfavorable. Today's declaration, so far as is known, was not proffered by and discussion with the powers.

The Turkish ambassador described the privileges abrogated as relating to economies and the administration of justice.

"These restrictions weigh heavily on the Ottoman states, both materially and morally," he said. "Turkey has been prevented from introducing reforms which it has been accused of delaying precisely by powers, who, owing to the enjoyment of privileges, stood in the way of progressive action on the part of the government. Turkey has been deprived of that confidence which full independence gives to a state. Deprived of that independence the moral fibre of the nation relaxed."

In diplomatic circles the announcement of Turkey's attitude attracted the widest attention. The allies are known to expect at any moment a declaration of war by Turkey in behalf of Germany. Comment was heard among diplomats of the allied powers as to possible deliberations between the German foreign office and the Porte before the decision to abrogate the treaties was reached.

So far as diplomats of the allies would venture an opinion the prediction was made that Great Britain, France and Russia probably would not make any representations on the subject to Turkey at this time, leaving it until the close of the war.

**Prize of War.**

Plymouth, Sept. 10, via London.—The German bark Urania, bound from Icopilla, Chile, for Hamburg, with a cargo of nitrate valued at \$175,000 was captured by a British war ship.

London, Sept. 10.—British troops have met and defeated a German force of 400 which entered Nyassaland, British Central Africa, according to an announcement by the official press bureau.

**Belgians Are Victorious.**

London, Sept. 10.—An Ostend dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph company says:

"According to information from a reliable source the Belgian army at Antwerp has assumed a triumphant offensive movement, driving the Germans right back to the environs of Leuven."
