SAYS THAT THERE IS MONEY WILL BE A BUSY WEEK IN CROP

EXPERT'S VIEWS MANY INDICTMENTS

Says That Tobacco Can Be Raised on a Large Scale in Anderson County at Good Profit.

According to a letter received in Anderson yesterday, it is possible to raise tobacco in this section of the State and at a decided profit as well. The letter says that Anderson county The letter says that Anderson county land is well adapted to the raising of tolacco and the expert furnishing the information says that this county will find that the industry is a paying one, if the farmers of the county ever take to the idea.

The letter sent here was written by L. L. Clark of Mars Bluff, and he says that he is familiar with all the details of tobacco planting and he is will-

that he is familiar with all the details of tobacco planting and he is will-ing to come to Anderson and instruct the Anderson planters in the work of raising tobacco, if any of them care to take hold of the proposition. He agrees to come here, show the farm-ers how to get started and visit each of them once a day until the crop is harvested and cured provided a cer-tain number of farmers will go into
