"Black Leg" Disease Has Broken Out Again

FARMER BELOW CITY LOSES HEIFER WHICH WAS ATTACKED BY IT

55 COWS HAVE BEEN VACCINATED

By County Agricultural Agent to Make Them Impune From Dread Malady.

The death from the dread "black leg" disease of a heifer on the farm of Mr. Frank Arnold, several miles below the city, has given rise to considerable uneasiness among owners of cattle in that vicinity, causing them to have 55 cows treated with special serum which is calculated to ward off the disease.

"black leg" disease was in the nature of an accident, so to speak. Several days ago the heifer died, and, not knowing that the animal had succumbed to a highly contagious and very fatal disease, Mr. Arnold had the carcass hauled off and dumped in an open field. In skinning the heifer he noticed that one of the animal's legs was terribly swollen, and upon the occasion of a visit to the city later mentioned this fact in connection with a conversation relating to the death of the heifer.

among Mr. Arnold's cattle. In speaking of the matter yesterday, Mr. Byars stated that the source of this disease among cattle is always hard to trace. In short, there is little way of telling where it comes from or how it gets among cattle.

Mr. Byars is somewhat apprehensive regarding the case discovered on Mr. Arnold's farm. As a rule, when a cow dies of this disease the carcass is either burned or buried several feet deep, to offset any possibility of the malady spreading.

It will be recalled that a few weeks ago a case of black leg disease was discovered in the city, the cow that was infected dying soon after her case was discovered. In this instance, however, stringent measures were taken to prevent a spread of the disease.
