> FITTING SLEEVE PATTERNS The points marked A, B, C and D on the sketch should be noticed first in fitting. If, when the elbow is bent, the sleeve seems to pull from the shoulder, a section should be added at the top as shown at D. If this does not entirely remedy the fault make a few tiny gathers at the seam as at F. This. may make it necessary to add a small section at the bottom as at G. If the sleeve seems to draw from the front of the armhole a section added as at H will help it. I shows the alteration to be made when the sleeve draws from the back of the armhole.
