By virtue of a decretal order to me directed in the above entitled cause I will sell at Barnwell, S. C., in front of the Court House, on Monday, January 4th, 1926, it being salesday in said month, within the legal hours of sale, the following described real property (the timber and timber rights of the Savannah Timber Company, as shown by deed of J. E. Holley, dated the 8th day of March, 1917, to said Company, are excepted): All

that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Barnwell County, South Carolina, known as the Hammock tract, containing four hundred thirty-four (434) acres, more or less, and bounded on the North and West by lands now or formerly of the estate of Jesse Griffin, and on the South and East by lands of Ida O. Holley.

2. All that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Barnwell County, South Carolina, known as the Pine tract, containing two hundred seventy-five (275) acres, more or less, bounded on the North by lands of Ida O.
