Governor Hampton has removed Mr. W. M. Nelson from the office of treasurer of this county, and Dr. W. B. Peake from the auditorship. No appointments to fill these vacancies have yet been announced.

Judge Mackey filed, on Saturday afternoon last, his decision in the case involving the pardon granted by Governor Hampton to Amzi Rosborough, recently convicted at the Chester court. The opinion covers thirty-two pages of legal cap. The Judge holds that Hampton was duly elected and installed as governor, but suspends the order discharging the prisoner, recognizing the right of the sheriff to appeal—on the ground that if the Supreme Court sustain this decision, the prisoner may bring an action for damages against the sheriff for detaining him after a pardon was granted.

A NARROW ESCAPE.—The Columbia Register of Sunday last describes a narrow escape on the C. C. and A. R. R., as follows: "The down freight train on the Charlotte, Columbia and Augusta Railroad yesterday morning made a narrow escape from a disastrous accident, at Lewis' Turnout. We learn that a large pile of wood had been placed on the track in a cut near the station mentioned, but Conductor King and the engineer discovered the obstruction in time to reverse the engine and down brakes, and the train came to a halt within ten feet of the wood pile. The scoundrels who placed the obstruction on the track evidently intended to wreck the train and plunder the freight, but the vigilance of the train employees fortunately frustrated their designs. Lynch law is good justice for such villains when caught."

It is hoped that the taxpayers of Fairfield will respond promptly to Governor Hampton's call for a contribution for the maintenance of his government. Other counties are promptly paying their proportion, and in many instances the taxpayers are exceeding the demands made upon them. It will be remembered that Judge Mackey announced at court that he would cause indictments to lie against any one assuming to levy on property for taxes under the Chamberlain act, so-called. He distinctly declared, however, that he would not become a shield to protect the taxpayer from paying his just dues to the State. There must be a government, and every citizen must recognize one or the other. The citizen who fails to respond to Governor Hampton's call virtually refuses to recognize his government, and tacitly recognizes Chamberlain. No one must presume, therefore, to seek protection in the courts against Chamberlain's tax levy unless he can produce a receipt from Governor Hampton's tax receiver, showing that he has fulfilled his obligation to the constitutional government. A word to the wise is sufficient.

The Hampton tax collector in Sumter county has collected \$1,777 89, and has yet to go into the country.

A colored woman said to be one hundred and six years old was baptized at Beaufort on Sunday before last, by Rev. Kitt Green.

The Sumter Fire Engine Company, assisted by the ladies of the town, have been holding a fair. Net results, \$600.
