In Equity.—In the case of A. M. Lee, trustee, vs. J. A. Caldwell, bill for foreclosure, on reading and filing the report of A. M. Huger, Esq., on motion of A. T. Smythe, plaintiff's attorney, and with consent of the defendants, it was ordered that the report be confirmed, and that the land and premises described in the bill of complaint be sold by the referee, at public auction in Winnsboro, on terms of one-third cash, balance in one and two years. It was further ordered that the defendants, Jacob A. Caldwell and W. S. Hall, and all persons under their claiming, do stand henceforth and forever absolutely debarred of and from all equity of redemption in and to the said mortgaged premises.
