THE Revised Statutes of the United States, Sections 3232, 3237, 3238 and 3239, require every person engaged in any business, avocation, or exployment which renders him liable to a SPECIAL TAX, To Procure and place Conspicusly in his Establishment or place of Business a STAMP denoting the payment of said SPECIAL TAX for the Special Tax Year beginning May 1, 1877, before commence antiquing business after April 30. ing or continuing business after April 30,
