INVITED TO RETIRE.—The Columbia Register says that Governor Hampton on Saturday addressed a communication to the present Republican occupants of the State offices at the capital, inviting them to vacate and permit the legally elected officials to take possession. The request was accompanied with the assurance that as soon as the Supreme Court should sit, which would be shortly after the meeting of the Legislature, when that body would elect a chief justice, their claims to their respective offices would be submitted to that tribunal, and if found to be valid they would be reinstated. No reply has yet been received.
