Reports from the crops in the Wateree country are unfavorable. The stand in cotton is very poor, and the farmers have but little seed on hand for replanting. The crops are late over the whole county.

The town council of Ridgeway required the payment for licenses in advance. The saloon keepers did not see any money in paying cash for licenses and selling liquor on tick, and they have closed for the dull season.

In spite of the hard times we see signs of improvement. Mr. S. K. McDonald is erecting a very neat cottage which will soon be completed, and Mr. R. W. Phillips will shortly begin to build a store on the site formerly occupied by Major Hilliard's store.

All the principal patents on sewing machines expired on the 1st of May, and a great reduction in prices has resulted. The Singer company sell their machines at about fifty per cent. discount, and other companies in proportion. This is good news for persons who need machines.

Dr. C. H. Ladd has on his place twenty acres manured with bone phosphate, manufactured by himself from the skeletons of the numberless horses and mules that were killed by Sherman before crossing the river in his memorable raid. The phosphate is not adulterated as are many of the fertilizers sold these days.

Owing to indisposition, the Rev. C. E. Chichester was unable to conduct divine services at the Presbyterian church on Sunday, and his lecture in behalf of the Young Men's Christian Association was also postponed.

The Rev. Mr. Boyd preached at the Methodist church. He succeeds Mr. Walker, who has gone to Charleston.

Great credit is due both to the Historion Club and the Women's Christian Association for their recent entertainments. Despite the low rates charged for admission and refreshments, the former were able

to turn over fifty dollars and forty cents to the Rifle Club, and the latter realized sixty dollars, which will be applied to the use of the Young Men's Christian Association. Further entertainments promise equal success.

THE ELECTION.—The election passed off in the utmost quiet, and but for the fact that the polls were open, no one would have known that such a thing was going on. Up to the hour of going to press the vote is about 1300 for Gaillard and Brice, and a few scattering. The Radicals made no opposition, and but few negroes voted—these, almost without exception, casting their votes for the Democratic nominees. The vote at Winnsboro stood, for Gaillard, 413; for Brice, 411.
