Associate Justice.—The Democratic members of the Legislature held a caucus on Thursday night, for the selection of a candidate for the position of associate justice of the supreme court, made vacant by the promotion of Judge Willard to the chief justiceship. The following is the result : First ballet-McIver, 27; Haskell, 10; Wallace, 12; Kershaw, 12; Tracy, 6. Second ballot---McIver, 30; Haskell, 25; Kershaw, 11; Wallace, 10. Third ballot-McIver, 37; Haskell, 10; Wallace, 9; Kershaw, 9. Before the declaration of the result of the third bollot numbers of members changed their votes, until McIver's vote reached 49--more than enough to deglare him the choice of the caucus -and he was so declared, when an adjournment followed.
