**AN IMPORTANT QUESTION SETTLED.**—The Supreme Court has just rendered a decision in the case of Whipper vs. Reed—which, it will be remembered, involves the question of the tenure of office of circuit judges. Judge Reed was elected in 1875, to take the place of Judge Graham, who died before the expiration of his term, and Whipper was elected in 1876. Judge Reed refused to surrender to Whipper, on the ground that a judge holds his office for a full term of four years, whensoever elected, and consequently there was no vacancy in the first circuit. The Supreme Court sustains this view, the opinion of Chief Justice Willard, concurred in by Associate Justice McIver, concluding as follows: "Judge Reed was clearly entitled to hold for a term of four years from his election to suc-

ceed Judge Graham, and was properly in office at the time this action was brought; and accordingly the complaint should be dismissed." This decision settles also the case of Judge Carpenter, and fully establishes the right of General Kershaw to the judgeship of the fifth circuit.
