CARDOZO ARRESTED.—The Columbia Register of Sunday contains the following:

The event of the day yesterday was the arrest of ex-State Treasurer Cardozo, who is charged by the investigating committee with having misappropriated public moneys belonging to the State. At 1 o'clock the ex-State official was brought into Trial Justice Marshall's office, accompanied by his counsel, Judge S. W. Melton; General Conner and Louis Leconte, Esq., appearing for the State. The evidence was heard upon the part of the State. Mr. Wells, the book-keeper of the present Treasurer, testified to the present itemized account, amounting to \$15,816.90, which the books of the Treasurer's office showed had been improperly paid by Cardozo to T. W. Price & Co. It is claimed by the committee that Cardozo misapplied this amount of money to the payment of this claim, there being a special enactment of the Legislature forbidding the money to be applied for the purpose. After argument on the part of counsel, Justice Marshall held the ex-Treasurer in the sum of \$20,000, to appear at the Court of General Sessions in October next. The bail was given about 8 o'clock last evening, and Cardozo released.
