THE REDUCTION OF WAGES.—The Columbia Register states that it was in error in its announcement, to the effect that the wages of the working men on the Charlotte, Columbia & Augusta Railroad were to be reduced ten per cent. on the 1st of October, and adds in explanation: "We understand that the pay of the laborers is not to be interfered with. The only change that will be made, will be a slight reduction in the case of four or five employes, which reduction will only equalize their wages with those of similar employes on a connecting road. We understand that the road is doing well, and anticipates a large business during the coming winter."

ALMOST AN ACCIDENT.—Some wretch, bent on mischief, placed a few days ago an obstruction on the railroad track, and, but for its time-

ly removal, there would have been a serious accident. A rail was stuck firmly under one of the "stringers," and pointed in the direction of the next-coming train. Had the train come, of course it would either have been thrown violently from the track, or would have torn up the "stringer." In either event a serious smash-up would have resulted. The obstruction was discovered by Mr. D. R. Flenniken, and by him communicated to the section-hands in time to avoid any bad consequences.
