THE REDUCTION OF WAGES .- The Columbia Register states that it was in error in its announcement, to the effect that the wages of the working men on the Charlotte, Columbia & Augusta Railroad were to be reduced ten per cent. on the 1st of October, and adds in explanation: "We understand that the pay of the laborers is not to be interfered with. The only change that will be made, will be a slight reduction in the case of four or five employes, which reduction will only equalize their wages with those of similar employes on a connecting road. We understand that the road is doing well, and anticipates a large business during the coming winter."
