NEWS OF THE DAY.

Amos P. Cowardin, a brilliant young journalist of Richmond, is dead.

While the Russians are accomplishing nothing in Turkey in Europe; they have severely defeated Mukhtar Pasha in Asia Minor.

James Gilfillan has been appointed Treasurer of the United States. What a name to stick on a crisp green back!

The government of India has offered \$25,000 for the best machine for manufacturing the ramie fibre. American inventors are invited to compete.

The Spanish government intends to remonstrate with the United States against the duty of fifty cents per ton on Spanish shipping entering United States ports.

The centennial of Burgoyne's defeat was celebrated on the 17th inst., at Saratoga, New York, with an immense attendance. The speaker and officers wore badges ornamented with devices made of palmetto sent from South Carolina for this occasion.

The Supreme Court of the United States is three years behindhand in its business, and is losing ground. Senator Davis proposes relief by appointing a greater number of circuit judges, and making of these, with their respective district judges, intermediate appellate courts.

The Rev. E. T. Baird, of the Presbyterian Publication Committee, was recently put on trial in Richmond for alleged embezzlement. After examining the three principal witnesses for the prosecution, the judge with the consent of the solicitor, instructed the jury to return a verdict of not guilty.

After a most heated contest, in France, the Republicans have defeated the MacMahon party, composed of clericals, conservatives and monarchists. MacMahon used all his powers to elect a majority, but gained only forty seats in the assembly, leaving a Republican majority still of over a hundred.

President Hayes has made the following appointments: Envoys Extraordinary and Ministers Plenipotentiary—Edward F. Noyes, of Ohio, France; James Russell Lowell, of Massachusetts, Spain; John A. Kasson, of Iowa, Austria; Thomas A. Osborn, of Kansas, Chili; Henry W. Hilliard of Georgia, Brazil. Ministers Resident—John L. Stevens, of Maine, Sweden and Norway; James M. Conly, of Ohio, Hawaiian Islands; John M. Langston, (colored) of District of Columbia, Republic of Hayti. The mission to England has not been filled.

Gen. John M. Harlan, of Kentucky, has been appointed Associate Justice by President Hayes, vice David Davis. Harlan is the leader of the Kentucky Republicans, their standing candidate for governor, is forty years old, a partner of Bristow, and is the best speaker and one of the ablest lawyers in Kentucky. His integrity is unquestioned.

The defense of Senator Patterson, as stated in the pleadings, rests on the following grounds: First, That Hampton is not Governor; second, that there was no legal grand jury and duly elected Judge; third, that the Chief Justice (Willard), who ordered the special term, was not the legal Chief Justice; fourth, that the General Assembly which appointed the committee of investigation was illegal; fifth, that Chief Justice Willard, Judge Kershaw and the grand jury conspired against the rights and liberties of Patterson, and that the indictments were the results of the conspiracy; sixth, that he was not a fugitive from justice; seventh, that the Constitution only allowed a State to demand a fugitive from a State, and that the District of Columbia not being a State the Constitution did not apply, and the act of Congress authorizing the Chief Justice to surrender fugitives was unconstitutional and void.

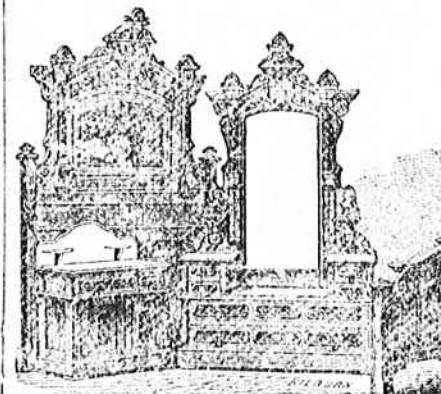
