The News and Courier announces that the South Carolina Railroad will make close connection with the Greenville and the Charlotte road. The train will leave Charleston at 5, a. m., and reach Columbia at 11, a. m. This will insure the delivery in Winnsboro of the Charleston papers on the evening of their day of publication.

George Lewis, a well known colored man in Winnsboro, was sitting on the fence by the big gully on Gully street, Wednesday night, listening to services in the colored Baptist church near by, when he fell backwards into the gully a distance of about thirty feet. CONGRESSMAN SMALLS CONVICTED.—The case of Robert Smalls was submitted to the jury on Saturday evening. Smalls, it will be remembered, is charged with having accepted from Joe Woodruff a bribe of five thousand dollars to vote for a certain bill giving the Republican Printing Company a large sum of money. A special telegram to THE NEWS AND HERALD, received on Monday evening, says: "The jury returned a verdict of 'Guilty' against Smalls yesterday morning. The case of L. Cass Carpenter has been in progress to day, and it will probably be given to the jury to-night."

Israel Byrd ought to follow the example of Nash, Corwin, Maxwell Sammy Green and Gaillard, and resign his seat in the Senate. Fence Law Election.

FOR the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of township No. 10, Fairfield county, a proposition to alter the Fence Law, in accordance with the provisions of An Act of the General Assembly of this State, approved June 7th, 1877, it is hereby ordered that an election be held in said township, on Tuesday the 11th day of December next.
