## IT IS WAR. <br> The Turkish Comell of Ministerm Haveso Dechared.

Constantinople, April 17.-T' council of ministers, after a ses sion at the palace to-day, de
clared that war had broken out on the frontier, owng to the in
cursion by the Greeks on Turkish cursion by the Greeks on Turkish
territory, ant Etham Pasha, the Turkish military commander, was ordered to assume the offensive
This announcement of the actual existence of a state of war on the frontier was at first misunderstood, reports th t the cotancil of
mimsters had declared war upon upon Greece being widely circulated.
It was also reported that the council of ministers had decided minister at Bey, the Turkish passports to Prince Maurocordato the Greek mimster at Constanthnople. These reports of the severance of all diplomatic relations between Turkey and Greece having been decided on, a circuthat the powers, in a pirit justice, will agree that the entire responsibility for the war falls on Greece. Turkey has no idea of conquest, the circular note adds, and as fresh proof of pacific sentiments, the sublime port offers to retire the Turkish troops on the frontier if Greece will re-
tire her forces from the frontier and from Crete.
News of fighting between the Greeks and the Turks at Nezeros, just within the Greek frontier line in Thessaly and due south of Mount Olympus, have been received. The fighting originated, in an attempt upon the reports, the Turkish forces to the part of adrances post.
