IT IS WAR.

The Turkish Council of Ministers Have so Declared.

Constantinople, April 17.—The council of ministers, after a session at the palace to-day, declared that war had broken out on the frontier, owing to the incursion by the Greeks on Turkish territory, and Edham Pasha, the Turkish military commander, was ordered to assume the offensive. This announcement of the actual existence of a state of war on the frontier was at first misunderstood, reports that the council of ministers had declared war upon Greece being widely circulated.

It was also reported that the council of ministers had decided to recall Assim Bey, the Turkish minister at Athens, and give passports to Prince Maurocordato, the Greek minister at Constantinople. These reports of the severance of all diplomatic relations between Turkey and Greece having been decided on, a circular issued expresses the hope that the powers, in a spirit of justice, will agree that the entire responsibility for the war falls on Greece. Turkey has no idea of conquest, the circular note adds, and as fresh proof of pacific sentiments, the sublime port offers to retire the Turkish troops on the frontier if Greece will retire her forces from the frontier and from Crete.

News of fighting between the Greeks and the Turks at Nezeros, just within the Greek frontier line in Thessaly and due south of Mount Olympus, have been received. The fighting originated, according to the Greek reports, in an attempt upon the part of the Turkish forces to occupy an advanced post. The movement was opposed by the Greek forces, whereupon the Turks opened fire and a sharp engagement lasting four hours ensued. The Greeks eventually retreated. Their losses are not known. This engagement occurred yesterday. At 5 o'clock this morning heavy firing between the Turks and Greeks near Nezeros was resumed. The Greeks in the meanwhile had been brought into play upon the Turkish posts at Kotroul. The latter was eventually destroyed with dynamite.

It is reported that the Greeks have occupied three Turkish stations, and that the Turks are retreating. Crown Prince Constantine, the Greek commander-in-chief, and General Macris were up all night dispatching orders to the front. No further news has been received from Macedonia regarding the movements of the Greek irregulars.

Don't Be Deceived.

As has been the history of every effort made by the industrial masses to bring about "Equal rights to all and special privileges to none," that element which clamors for and has grown fat on "special privileges" have at last resorted to their favorite defence,—the use of money. When the people rise in the assertion of their rights in demanding a more equal sharing of the burdens of government, this privileged class—the money barons—strive for awhile to stem the tide with their specious arguments, financial theories, and high-sounding words, but when they at last see that the people are in earnest and refuse to be deceived by such glittering generalities, then it is that this "privileged class" turn to that remedy which has served them on many occasions in the past—

the use of their ill-gotten gold—and with it corrupt, buy up or subsidize every influence which they see or know will be of service to them in deceiving or fooling the people, and thus for a little time longer succeed in riveting the chains of financial slavery still tighter on a too confiding people.

This course is now being pursued all over the land, and South Carolina is not free from these Benedict Arnolds and political Judases. Not many months will elapse before the people will see and know who these rascals are, but not until they have had time to inoculate many unsuspecting Alliancemen and voters with their gold-cure virus. Keep a wary eye on these fellows, Alliancemen, and don't allow their paid-for "convictions" to deceive you into believing their silly rot. —Exchange.
