The longest books in the New Testament are Matthew and the Acts, each of which consists of 449.95 319 60 twenty-eight chapters, although Luke contains more verses and words. Third John is the shortest, containing one chapter of four-\$36,094.40 teen verses and 296 words. The longest chapter in the Old Testament is the 119th Psalm, which contains 176 verses. The shortest chapter is the 117th Psalm. which contains but two verses. The longest chapter in the New Testament is the first chapter of Luke, it contains eighty verses; the shortest is 1 John, first chapter, it contains ten verses. The longest verse in the Old Testament is the 9th verse of the Sth chapter of Esther, it contains 90 words, composed of 426 letters; the shortest is the 25th verse of the 1st chapter of I Chronicles, consisting of 3 words and 12 let ters. The middle verse is the 8th verse of the 118th Psalm. The 19th chapter of II Kings and remedy. Sold by J. F.
