The country will awake in a few years from its present protection debauch, and I would open the way for raising revenue by direct taxation. In my judgment, this would of itself tend to cut down extravagant expenditures, and would thus at the same time accomplish two leading reforms of the Democratic platform, reducing expenses to the necessities of the Government economically and honestly administered, and compelling wealth to bear its just proportion of the burdens of taxation.
