### Verdict, Guilty.

The Court of Inquiry appointed by Governor Ellerbe to investigate the campus conflict between the students, the military and the police, have completed their investigation and made their report, which was to the effect that Adjutant General Watts had transgressed his authority and that he should be reprimanded by Governor Ellerbe "for serious lack of judgement and disregard of the rights of others" on this occasion, and that he be reported to the General Assembly to whom he is amenable for any official misconduct, and may be impeached upon the facts in these findings. The cost of this investigation to the State was \$327.65.

### Progressive Farming.

H. J. Gregory & Co. made a fine crop of oats on their Lathan farm. Besides what they have housed in the sheaf to feed on, they threshed 2,170 bushels. The land upon which these oats grew has been either planted in pease and corn, or sowed in pease, from which they will gather another big crop.

Mr. J. N. Addison, manager of Heath, Springs & Co's Green farm near the river also made a rousing big crop of oats, of which he has threshed about 1,800 bushels. He, too, has planted his stubble land in pease and corn, or sowed it down in pease.

## SHOT THROUGH BRAIN.

**T. H. WANNAMAKER KILLS CHAS. F. JONES.**

Trouble Grew Out of Wannamaker's Testimony at the Trial of Dan C. Murphy in Orangeburg.

### Special to The State.

Bamberg, June 22 — A difficulty occurred here to-day between Mr. T. Herber Wannamaker and Mr. Chas. F. Jones, in which Mr. Wannamaker shot Mr. Jones in the head, inflicting instant death.

The trouble was the outgrowth of bad feeling engendered between the two during the noted Copes-Murphy trial in Orangeburg about two years ago, in which Mr. Wannamaker gave some testimony regarding Mr. Jones' character, at which the latter took exceptions.

Mr. Wannamaker is a member of the New York cotton exchange and connected with the firm of Robert Moore & Co., and is now in the south traveling in the interest of the firm's business and is an exceedingly popular young man of brilliant attainments.

Mr. Jones was several years ago a State constable, a man of splendid physique, and acted in the capacity of special detective in the Murphy case.

The two met to-day on the street in front of Messrs. Jones' livery stables, and after some words and blows Mr. Wannamaker fired the fatal shot, which, he claims was in self-defense. After the shooting he surrendered to the sheriff, and will apply for bail to-morrow. The coroner's inquest is being held this evening.
