## SWEPT BY THE STORM

The Coast of New Jersey Devas trated.

Cape May N. J., Oct. 25.-One of the fiercest northeast gales for years has swept the lower Jersey coast and upper Delaware Bay for the past twenty four hours.

From Millville comes the re port that the big tides in the Mau rice river have flooded all the oyster houses and several have blown dowh. The Ocean City and Maurice river branch es of the west Jersey railroad are submerged. Nearly a mile of the away near Egg Harbor City and the mail coach between that place and Tuckerton was held up o-day by tlooded roads.

## The Price of Silver

We beg our readers to note the
sensitiveness of silver in the
market. It has recently risen
nearly 7 ? cents above the low
price of September 1, and the
only reason that experts can give
for it is "rumor" that purchases
have been made for India, and
"rumor" that India is buying for
coinage. Back of these "rumors"
is the announcement of the atti-
tude of the Bank of England with
respect to its silver reserve. The
recovery in the market price of
silver dates from that announce-
ment, so that notwithstanding the
llimsy nature of the prospects, the
tluctuation gives the reason for
the surmise that something im-
portant is going on behind the
scenes.
When the mints of India closed
the financial world is indescriable Our readers know what occurred in this country. The destruction of values could not have been more serious if the earth had opened and swallowed half the property in existence in the Unied States. And though the earth did not opeu, nevertheless prices and values fell one-half as compared with gold, and the resalt was the most terrible panic ever known in the history of the counry.
If it should happen that the India council is preparing to re open tho mints of that country, after compassing a world-wide destruction of property, the con clusion of rational men must b that those who planned that scheme and carried it out ar either glutted with their ill-gotte gains, or have suddenly aroused themselves to the fact that they have been playing with fire. And this is the most natural conclu. sion, for statistics show that it is not only the agricultural and in dustrial classes who have suffered the ill effects of the financial cataclysm of 1893. Hundreds of prosperous banks, national, state, and private, have been wiped out, and the business of some of the largest has been narrowed down to a point not contemplated by the promoters of the gold standard.

- But the point we desire to make
is this. If silver is so sensative as to increase 7 t cents on the ounce upon mere "rumors" of : purpose on the part of the India council to reopen the India mints, what would be the result if the mints of the United States were to be opened to its free comage This sensitiveness is no new fea ture. In 1890, when it wa thought that Congress would en act free coinage, the price of sil ver bullion rose to $\$ 1.20$ an ounce in gold in all the markets of the world, lacking only 9 cents an ounce of reaching parity, and a! because of a supposition.
