OUR SCHOOLS.

While we are devoting so much of our time to politics, our schools deserve more than a passing notice. Newberry College will resume exercises on the 1st of October, with fair prospects of a successful year.

The Female Seminary has entered upon another scholastic year. The building has been enlarged and rendered more commodious, the corps of teachers is full, and altogether the advantages enjoyed by their pupils are not inferior to those offered by many Female Colleges.

The Prosperity High School is again under way, and the new Principal finds the outlook encouraging. While the school is only a few years old, it is almost indispensable to that part of our county, and the people of Prosperity are justly proud of it.

Monday's News and Courier contains a long letter from editor Dawson, who is in New York on the political situation. This year 401 electors will be chosen, the vote necessary to elect the President being, therefore, 201.

The Abbeville Medium says that the word "free" in that State, supported in whole or in part by the public funds shall be free and open, is redundant, and he shows conclusively that the legislature has not construed it as meaning that tuition must be free in the State University.
