Washington, September 10.-The annual report of Commissioner of Pensions Ware places the total number of pensioners now on the rolls at 996,445, of which 729,356 are addiers and 267,189 are widows and dependents. Mr. Ware announces that it is not probable that the pension roll will again cross the million line, the high water mark having been reached a year ago.

The roll shows a net loss of 2,901 hand during the year, 130,109 unsafe and dangerous condition. were admitted and 113,794 rereached \$1,765,310.
