Programme of Tournament

TO BE GIVEN AT ORANGEBURG S. C., MAY 1st, 1872.

The Knights will assemble at the Old Paraly Ground at half-past nine o'clock the line will be formed at ten precisely, Miller's Brass Band, of Charleston, leading the column. The line of march will be through Main Street to Railroad, and from there to the Tournament ground, arriving there the Knights will be formed in line in front of the judges stand where the rules governing the riding will be read. The exercises will begin at eleven o'clock. The Knights will ride in the following order:

Table with columns: NAME, RESIDENCE, CHARACTER. Lists names of knights and their details.

The following rules will govern the TOURNAMENT:

FIRST. All Knights must be in full costume. SECOND. The Knights will ride in the order in which they are in line. THIRD. The distance to be run will be seventy-five yards, each Knight will be required to complete the ride within seven seconds, and should any Knight fail to come up to the time specified, he shall be ruled out by the judges for that ride.

When the riding has been completed, the Knights will form in front of the judges stand, when their decision will be given and prizes awarded. The winner of the first prize will then make his selection for Queen of Love and Beauty. And in like manner the winners of the second and third prizes will select the first and second Maids of Honor.
