Carbolic Acid for Lice on Animals.

We have so many letters, the American Agriculturist says, asking for and recommending cures, that we are induced again to allude to that wonderfully effective destroyer of such vermin, Carbolic Acid. This is used in the form of soaps which may be easily applied in water, making a moderately strong suds. Cresylic acid is a cognate substance, almost always associated with carbolic acid and under the trade name of "Cresylic Soap," an excellent article is advertised and furnished. We have employed this soap to rid our shelves of ants, our cupboards of cockroaches, poultry of lice, dogs and cats of fleas, and not having occasion to use it upon our horses or neat stock, have supplied acquaintances whose stables were infested. We have even prescribed a bath of Cresylic Soap and water for a newly arrived immigrant, and in every case of its application have had the satisfaction of learning of its efficacy. Farewell to mercurial ointment, that efficient, but very dangerous article in careless hands! So long as we obtain carbolic compounds we banish it.

RE-POTTING PLANTS.—During a residence of some years near to a nursery, with the proprietor of which I was on intimate terms, I was surprised at the number of complaints made by amateurs, &c., as to the difficulty they experienced in re-potting plants. From conversations with my friend, I elicited the following facts: My friend was in the habit of supplying young window plants—Geraniums, Fuschias, &c., to his customers, many of whom brought their own pots. The plants generally did well the first year, but when they were attempted to be transferred to larger pots, in nine cases out of ten they died. His explanation to me was simple and feasible, and experience has taught me its truth. Of the pots brought to him, great care and attention were invariably paid to the insides, as it was deemed superfluous to wash the inside of a pot into which soil was to be put. The consequence was, that when the plants came to be re-potted, they could not, by any fair means, be made to leave the pots, and a knife had to be used to induce them to do so, which, in most cases, destroy the roots, causing decay of the plant, and frequently death.—The simple remedy for this is, before putting the soil into a pot to well wash and scrub with a brush the inside of the pot with soap and water. When this is done, a smart tap, of the hand on the bottom of the pot will, at any future time bring the plant and soil out in one solid and compact mass, and the difficulty experienced in re-potting is obviated.—Gardener's CHRON.

How to HAVE PLENTY OF FORAGE.—The farm must be horribly poor, or its management execrable, on which are not made fodder, shucks, oat, barley and wheat straw enough to supply all the stock with "rough food."

If wheat be cut in the dough state, as it should be, and threshed out as soon as dry enough, the straw, well preserved, will be first-rate food for any kind of stock, even for sheep, as I know from experience. Yet there are not a few farmers in our State, on whose places you may see every fall, immense piles of wheat straw rotting, and whose cattle are decimated every winter by actual starvation.
