Farm and Garden.

Agriculture in the General Pursuit of man: It is the Basis of all others, and therefore, the most Useful and Honorable."

FARM NOTES .- It pays to raise corn for winter forage-plant in drills, a bushel to the acre. Cut stalks two feet from the ground, if large; cure in stacks tied at the top till the stalk is dry (some four weeks), then house, and not stack out for rains to damage the forage. Our barns and stock-sheds are generally poor and small. This is bad economy. Split more boards, and make large and tight shedroofs to protect both stock and stockfeed. Then cattle do better, and drop their manure under cover, and out of washing rains. One load of such manure is worth more than five loads of old weathered stuff, with all the salts of amonia, potash, and lime taken out of it. A farmer who would sell fine mules of his own raising for copper cents and think them gold engles, would not be more mistaken than thousands are, in regard to the true value of fertilizers. What all boys ten years old ought to know, their fathers have yet to learn. That is, the value of carbon and the elements of water in well-dripped out-door manure, of Everybody to know that which they generally form ninety-eight per cent. Think of it, the precise things wthat form all manure are unknown to planters and farmers. Is this wisdom, or is it folly? Our best friends on the farm are named carbon, oxygen, hydrogen, nitrogen, phosphorus, and sulphur. To these add potash, magnesia, lime, iron, and chlorine, and you will have the elements of good manure.





The negroes have made equally as g od crops as the whites, were more attentive to field and lot duties, more compliable and obliging in everything required of them, and decidedly more adhering to their contracts; in a word, covering all points, they are much to be preferred to the white labor. The white laborers were contentions, seeking every advantage. fault finding, and considered their contracts as something which he might turn into some speculation to his own advantage pecuniarily, or in saving him from labor. Their wants are insatiable, and their worst features are so soon as the crops have been made, commences with them, "they must begin to know about another year's contract." Before hinting it to their employers, they commence tampering with the negroes, telling them they have not been paid high enough for their services, and putting them up to exact more.
