GOES TO VIRGINIA - The Columbia Register says, Rev. J. B. Haskell, who has been stationed in Orangeburg, as pastor of the Lutheran Church for some time past, has received a call to the pastorate of the Church at Stanton, Virginia, and leaves forthwith for his new field of labor. Dr. Haskell preached his farewell sermon in this State at the Lutheran Church in this city on Saturday last. The sermon is spoken of by those who heard it as a masterpiece of composition and eloquence. The young pastor carries with him the prayers and good wishes of all who know him in this State.

D. A. Straker, Esq., the colored lawyer of this Town went to Columbia on Wednesday of this week to ask Executive clemency for Vandy Goldson, sentenced to 10 years in the Penitentiary at the October term of Court, for horse stealing. Governor Hampton instantly signed the pardon, and Goldson is free once more. Mr. Straker says, Governor Hampton received him courteously, and expressed a strong wish that the colored man should be protected in all his rights as a citizen, also the Governor expresses a determination to leave no stone unturned in finding Coleman who shot Police Marshal Washington of this Town a few weeks ago.

On Tuesday last, this town was the scene of a sad and terrible accident which resulted in the death of one of our worthy young citizens, Mr. E. M. Robinson. While testing the speed of his horse on the old Orangeburg Road near where Mr. Tucker recently resided, when the animal bolted and ran between several pines near the road in such a manner as to strike the head of the rider against one of the trees. Medical assistance being near examined the unfortunate man and found that his skull was fractured and that the chances for his recovery was beyond early help. He was taken to his residence accompanied by two of prominent physicians who remained with him until the last spark of life went out, which

was about 11 o'clock that night. His funeral was held at the Presbyterian Church on Thursday last. We tender our heartfelt sympathies to his relatives and friends.

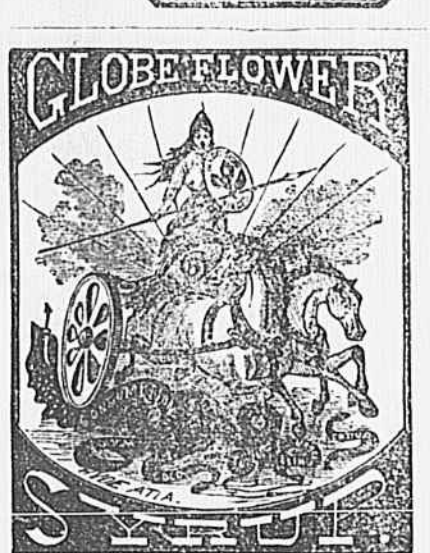
