MILLIONS IN TOBACCO.

Crop in this State Worth Almost Three
Times as Much as Last Year.

Columbia, September 19:—An in-
crease of 12,600,905 pounds of to-
bacco for August, 1917, over the
same month last year is shown in
the report of Col E J Watson, State
Commissioner of Agriculture, Com-
merce and Industries. The crop
brought \$4,824,396.96 more than
last season, he says. There were
31,584,975 pounds grown at an av-
erage price of 23.61 cents, making
a net total to the farmers of the
State of \$7,523,941.64. The de-
partment received reports from 23
markets, containing 53 warehouses.
