

SOUTH CAROLINA BOYS

Have Their Own Club at Georgetown University.

The first meeting of the South Carolina Law Club, Georgetown University, Washington, D. C., was held on November 28, 1922, to outline a weekly series of lectures on South Carolina law. After each lecture there will be a social get-together of the South Carolina men.

The president is Thomas R. McConnell, Kingstree high school, 1918, connected with the Federal post office.

Ralph L. Knisley, Charleston, prepared at Charleston high school.

Frank J. Bostick, Wofford college A. B. 1917, is interested in journalism and identified with the treasury department of the federal government.

Honorable George E. Hamilton, LL. D., J. U. D., is Dean of Georgetown University Law school. Six members of the law faculty now give their full time to the school. These professors are: Assistant-Dean Hugh J. Fegan, insurance, agency and damages; Hon. Henry S. Boutell, former minister to Switzerland, international law; Hon. William J. Price, LL. D., former U. S. minister to Panama, evidence, negotiable instruments, criminal procedure, domestic relations and bankruptcy; Charles W. Tooké, contracts and property; Charles A. Keigwin, author of works in pleading and torts, former special assistant to the United States Attorney General and former assistant United States attorney for the District of Columbia; and Joseph de Sloovere, S. J. D. Harvard University, criminal law, real property, conflict of laws, sales and bailments.

To meet the latest requirements for legal education in this country, Georgetown University Law school, beginning October 1, 1923, will require at least one year's college work for entrance to the law school, and will offer a full pre-legal course during the evening hours at the downtown Washington buildings of the law school.

February 1st, 1923, the beginning of the second semester, is the last date on which high school graduates may enter Georgetown law school as candidates for the law degree.

Students of the Georgetown University Law school have access not only to the 11,000 books of the law department library in the downtown buildings of the University, but also to the 193,000 legal volumes of the congressional library.

Another member of the South Carolina law club, Georgetown University, is Alexander N. Brunson, Jr., Greenville, Wofford A. B. 1919, manager of both football and baseball teams, 1918 and 1919, member of Pi Kappa Phi, and employed by the United States treasury department.

Andrew M. Hood, Anderson, Ersikiae A. B. 1921, and stood third in last year's morning law class.

Ezekiel R. Stegall, Piedmont, received his A. B. from Furman in 1911, made the Philosophian society and is an employee of the United States treasury department.

George Brunson, Greenville, Wofford A. B. 1917, played college baseball for two years, was a member of Pi Kappa Phi, and works at the United States treasury department.

Julien D. Wyatt, Easley, Wofford A. B. and A. M. 1919, is also an alumnus of the University of South Carolina, has engaged in newspaper work, and is employed in the United States patent office.

Walter G. Ramseur, Central, received his A. B. from Wofford college in 1916, was manager of the 1915 football team, won a second place in the scholastic rank of his first year law class, 1922, and is secretary to Congressman Fred H. Dominick of the 3rd district.

Stephen A. Griffith, Saluda, third year law school, studied at the University of South Carolina.

Malcolm E. Crosland, Bennettsville, post-graduate at the Georgetown University Law school, was granted the degree of Bachelor of Laws by the University of South Carolina.

Cook Pork Well.

"Cook pork well" is the advice of the United States Department of Agriculture. Failure to observe this precaution is liable to be followed by serious illness known as trichinosis. This disease, which is very painful and frequently fatal, is caused by a small parasite that sometimes occurs in pork. The trichina parasite is so small that it can be seen only with a microscope, and is often overlooked in the most careful microscopic examination. Hogs harboring the parasites show no symptoms and pork containing trichinae is exactly the same in appearance as other pork. No practicable system of meat inspection has been discovered by which persons who eat uncooked or imperfectly cooked pork can be protected from the danger of trichinosis. There is, however, one very effective means of preventing the disease: **Cooking**

destroys the parasites. Hence properly cooked pork is safe and trichinosis can not be acquired if the simple rule is followed of cooking pork well before it is eaten.

As a consumer of by-products and farm waste the porker wins the championship.
